

Lecturer Position at Iowa State University

Applications are invited for a full-time non-tenure track lecturer position in the Department of Statistics. A successful candidate will be expected to provide excellent instruction in introductory and intermediate level statistics courses offered to undergraduate and graduate students across campus. The lecturer will be encouraged to participate in local, national and international statistical societies and conferences, especially with regard to efforts in statistics education. Primary duties include teaching three courses per semester, coordinating one of the multi-section introductory statistics courses, assisting with the training of instructors and graduate students, and additional duties as assigned by the Department Chair. This position includes opportunities to teach an introductory statistics course (Stat 101, 104 or 226), plus intermediate and advanced undergraduate courses, such as intermediate business statistics (Stat 326), introduction to probability and mathematical statistics (Stat 341 and 342), applied linear regression models (Stat 401), and design and analysis of experiments (Stat 402).

The Department of Statistics has a large and diverse faculty and maintains well established and effective B.S., M.S. and Ph.D. programs. The department's Undergraduate Program includes 60 undergraduate statistics majors and service teaching to more than 4,000 students across campus each year. The Undergraduate Program is led by three faculty members who are deeply committed to developing innovative advances in statistics education.
